2. The receiving institution will send its decision within [6] weeks.

TU Wien will send its invitation letter within 4 weeks after the official nomination of the candidate by the home institution.

3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than [5] weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]

TU Wien: Students can download and print out their official Transcript of Records from "TU Wien Information Services" (TISS) within 5 weeks after the exam.

4. Termination of the agreement

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the interinstitutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]

1. Grading systems of the institutions

I BARI 05: In the Italian university system, each course unit is graded on a scale from 18 to 30 points, (minimum 18 – maximum 30). To pass a course unit, a student must receive a grade of at least 18 points out of 30. 30 e lode is a special mention for outstanding performance.
